

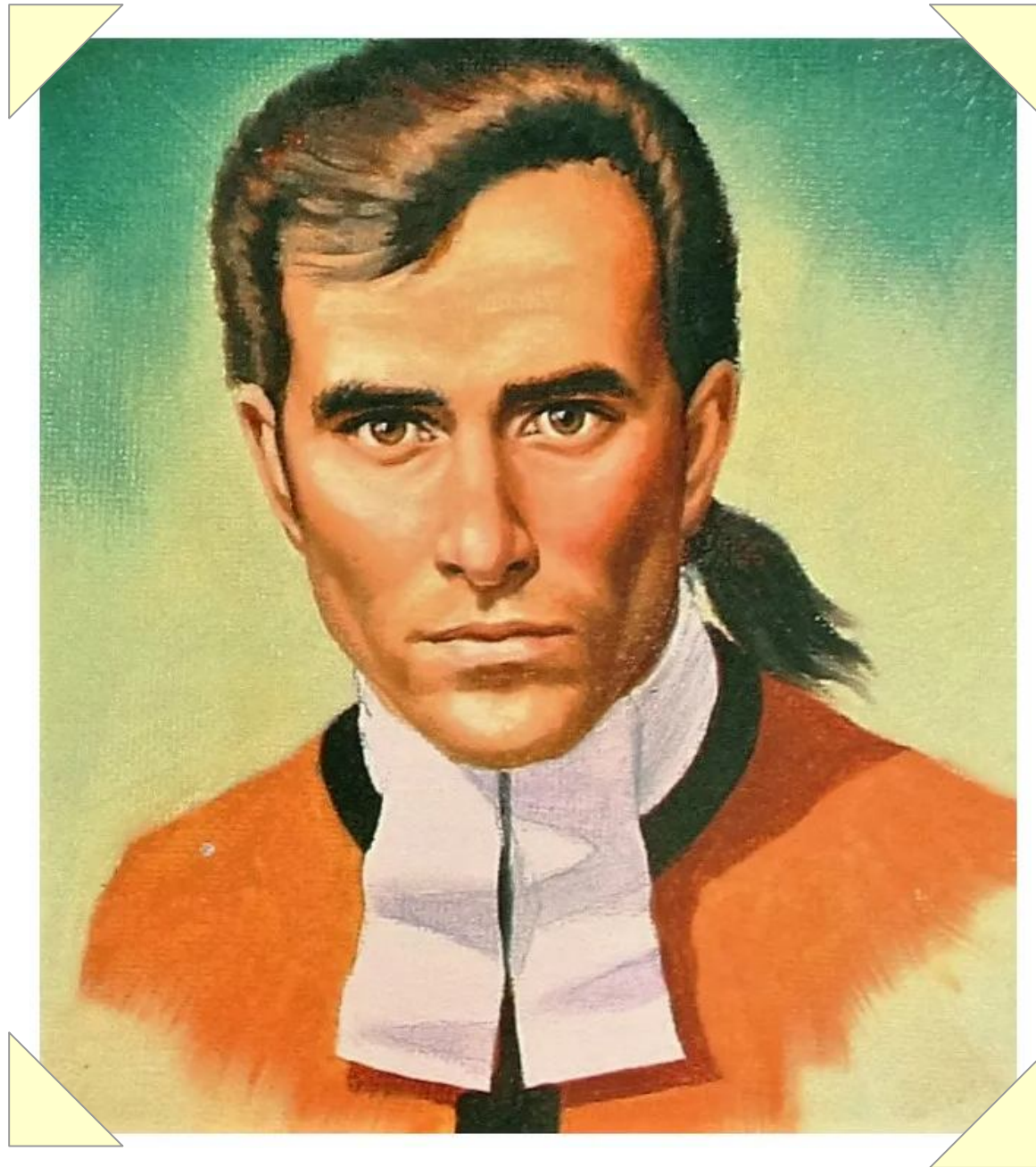

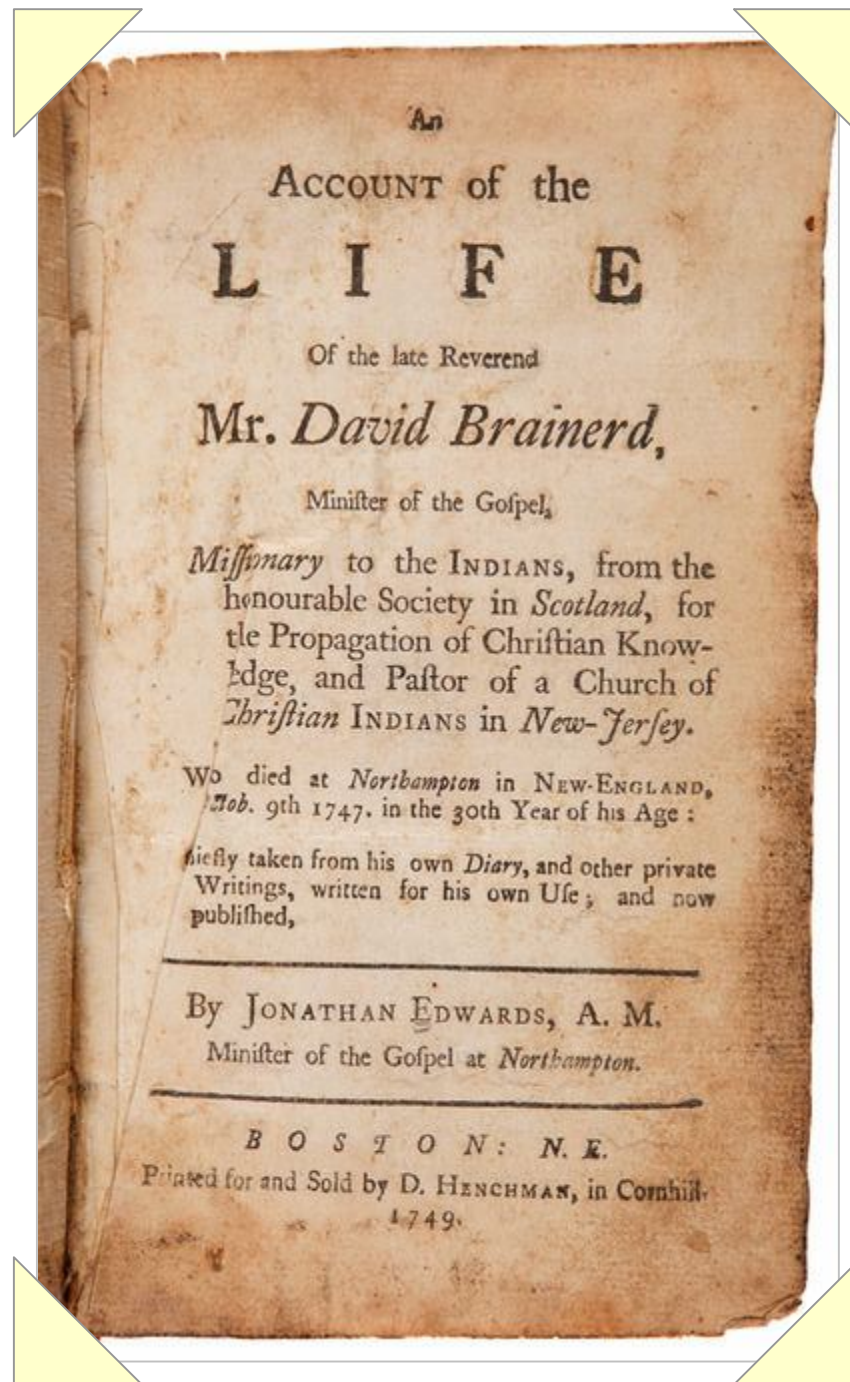

Saybrooks Feby 4. 1742|3

I received the line you sent me from Branford with satisfaction: but long'd if divine providence had permitted, to have seen yourself in the room of it. I have been so hurried of late and especially this week while a friend from Easthampton has been waiting for me to go with him, that I despaired of writing to you before I left the shore—having sundry other letters to write of absolute necessity— but divine providence has given me this opportunity for want of wind to sail, which I readily embrace, and O that my time in writing and yours in reading these lines may be spent for the glory of our blessed Lord and Master who takes an account of every idle word and every idle
