## Basic Overview:

This fun night is designed to get the kids to say a bunch of checkpoints from their books. How it works is that you will print off and cut up a number of tickets (a sheet of tickets is included below). Give the leaders in each classroom a stack of tickets for their class to fill out (it is probably best to aim for about 8 tickets per child so you have enough). Each checkpoint or page that the child completes will earn them the chance to write their name on one ticket. At the end of book time, the leaders will gather up all of the tickets and put them all together in the box that the commander is holding.

At the end of the night (or in opening time the following week), the commander will draw ten tickets out of the box and read off the winning tickets. Try to ensure that each classroom has at least one winning ticket from it if possible. One suggestion that will make this easier is to print off the tickets on different colored paper (in other words, the 6th grade tickets would be on orange paper, 5th grade tickets would be on yellow paper, 4th grade tickets would be on blue paper, 3rd grade tickets would be on white paper, etc.) Those whose name is read can come up to the front and choose a prize.
